



Welcome to the Family Birth Place




MAIN ENTRANCE

Labor and Delivery Private Room

- Upon arrival, you will be examined to determine your stage of labor
- There is always a board-certified obstetrician that can care for any patient, even if your personal obstetrician has not arrived yet

Labor and Delivery Private Room

- Vaginal births take place in a Labor and Delivery Room, each with a private bathroom and shower
- An anesthesiologist is available 24/7 to administer an epidural
- The baby warmer is turned on when birth is imminent











- Englewood Health has a Level-3 NICU, which treats premature babies from 28 weeks on.
 If a baby is born between 24-28 weeks, Englewood
- If a baby is born between 24-28 weeks, Englewood Health staff work closely with Hackensack University Medical Center to transfer both the mother and baby(ies) to their facility. Hackensack University Medical Center has a Level-3 NICU that specializes in preemies 24+ weeks.

Parents can rest easy knowing their baby's health is in excellent hands through every stage of pregnancy. Our Maternal and Fetal Medicine Center combines medical expertise with advanced technology to diagnose and manage maternal or fetal problems. If you're at high risk for complications, your obstetrician will work with our specialists to identify those complications, discuss them with you, and begin to coordinate treatment and care plans to ensure the best possible outcome for mom and baby.

* After delivery, the baby will be examined, the cord is clamped, and the newborn is placed on mother's chest for bonding






SUPPORT PERSON/VISITOR ACCOMMODATIONS

- Each room includes a sleeping area for the support person for the duration of the mother's stay
- Comfortable couches convert to sleeper beds

- Breastfeeding classes are held during your stay
- The night before discharge, a nurse will review everything the parents have been taught during their stay








Will I have a private room?

• We have 21 spacious private rooms and 3 semiprivate rooms (for two mothers) in our Mother/ Baby Unit. Private rooms are assigned when available, but cannot be guaranteed. If you are in a semi-private room and a private room opens up, we will make every attempt to move you or your roommate.





- Are there car seat requirements I must meet before leaving the hospital?
 - Please install your car seat at least three weeks prior to your due date to be sure you are prepared for the day you are discharged, and keep the instruction book easily accessible
 - If using an infant bucket car seat, bring only the bucket infant carrier to the Maternity Unit. Do not remove the base from the car.



(car seat requirements continued)

- If using a "go as you grow" car seat, do not remove it from your vehicle. It is not necessary to bring to the Maternity Unit.
- It is recommended that car seats should be six years old or less from the date manufactured
